

# How to select the best colours

*to give your garden that artistic touch*



Harmonious landscapes are achieved by selecting hues that are closely related to each other on the colour wheel such as such as blue, purple and violet.

Alternatively, generate a sense of energy and fun by playing with vivid complementary colours. Mix orange with blue; yellow with violet; or red with green for striking results.

**Foliage Features** > Many plants have very attractive stems and foliage that can also contribute to your landscape design. Silver foliated plants provide a useful contrast in garden design and also combine well with many of the cooler colours such as blue and mauve. Glossy green leaves contrast well with red flowers and are also soothing to the eye.



## *Oasis punnets*

Plants grown in Oasis punnets have stronger root systems and are easier to establish due to reduced root disturbance.

Simply squeeze each punnet cell at the base, gently remove the seedling, plant out and water.
